



**Diving:** Diving is not allowed.

**Pets:** Pets are not allowed in the pool or in the fenced pool area.

**Electronics:** People playing music must use headphones. Cell phones and lengthy cell phone conversations should be taken to the patio for privacy.

**Swimming Attire:**

- **Cover-Ups:** An appropriate robe/cover-up and flip-flops/slippers shall be worn by adults walking to and from the pool.
- **Swimwear:** All bathers must wear appropriate swimwear. The Marion County Health Department rules state that street clothes are not permitted within the fenced pool area as they could be carrying contaminants which could result in pool closure.
- **Clubhouse:** Swimming attire and/or bare feet are not permitted in the Clubhouse.
- **Towels:** Full-sized beach towels MUST be used to protect all pool furniture from suntan lotions and creams. Blankets, towels, etc., may not be hung or displayed on the pool fencing.
- **Rafts and Pool Floats:** Rafts, floating pool chairs and noodle floats may be used only when other bathers are not present in the pool. As soon as another person enters the pool, the raft or float must be removed. No pool floats may be stored in the bathhouse, pool enclosures or Clubhouse.

**Lifesaving Equipment:** The following lifesaving equipment is available at the pool:

- A ring-mounted on the east wall of the pool enclosure, is to be thrown to a swimmer in difficulty.
- A life pole and shepherd's crook type of pole, mounted on the south wall of the pool enclosure, are for reaching a struggling swimmer and pulling him/her to the side of the pool.
- A standard first-aid kit, recommended or approved for pools by the American Red Cross, is located by the Men's bathhouse entrance.
- A spinal board-for use by professionals only-with ties, and rigid cervical collars (small, medium, large) are mounted on the south wall by the Women's bathhouse entrance. The board and collars are for the use by health care professionals, and their use should not be attempted by people without proper training.
- Bathers are not permitted to tamper with or re- move such equipment from its established location for any purpose other than the intended emergency use.

*In case of an emergency, call 9-1-1. There is an emergency dedicated cell phone on the pool-side of the bathhouse that automatically dials 9-1-1. The entrance patio is the designated medical emergency care area.*



## POOL RULES

**Pool Hours**  
8:30 a.m. – 10:00 p.m.

*The Clubhouse and pool areas are smoke-free environments.*

*The swimming pool is for the exclusive use of Lions Head unit owners/residents and their guests.*

The pool is open from May through September, depending on the weather.

The Lions Head Condominium Association, Inc. is not responsible for loss, theft, or accidents suffered by residents or their guests. It is the right of unit owners/ residents to use the pool. It is a privilege for guests to use the pool. For the continued enjoyment of all, it is requested that unit owners/residents do not bring children under the age of 14 to the pool on weekends between 1:00p.m. and 3:00 p.m. A large number of unit owners/residents are employed during the week and do not have access to the pool. This request, if followed, will make it possible for employed residents to enjoy some quiet time at the pool on weekends.

- **Swim at Your Own Risk:** At all times swimming is at the individual's own risk. There is no life guard on duty.

- **Non-Swimmers:** Non-Swimmers shall not use the pool unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

- The swimming pool cannot be reserved for private parties.

- **Guest Policy:** Guests may use the pool only when the resident host/hostess is present in the Lions Head complex. The number of guests is limited to four persons per unit at any one time. Guests bringing guests is prohibited.



*The Indiana State Department of Health governs the use and operation of this pool, and its regulations have the force of law. The following Health Department regulations are to be observed and adhered to.*

- **Registration:** Everyone entering the pool enclosure is required to sign the register for emergency and liability issues. This registration desk is located outside the pool entrance gate on the right. Review the pool rules posted to the left of the gate before entering.

- **Health and Hygiene Regulations:** Persons having any disease of the eyes, ears, nose, throat, skin or any communicable disease shall not be permitted in the pool area or its patios. Persons having any exposed sub-epidermal tissues, open blisters, cuts and other conditions that are likely to become infected are not to use the pool. Persons who are incontinent are not permitted in the pool. Spitting, spouting of water, blowing the nose and other similar behaviors in the pool are strictly prohibited.

- **Fecal Accidents:** In the event of a fecal accident, the Marion County Health Department, in an effort to help prevent the spread of disease-causing organisms resistant to chlorine, has issued procedural instructions which necessitate the closing of the pool for 48 hours.

- **Vomit Accidents:** In the event of a vomit accident, the Marion County Health Department, in an effort to help prevent the spread of disease-causing organisms resistant to chlorine, has issued procedural instructions which necessitate the closing of the pool for 24 hours.

- **Spectator Areas:** The Health Department regulations state: "The spaces used by visitors and spectators and those used by bathers must be kept separate. Visitors and spectators in street clothes are allowed within the perimeter enclosure only if they are in a separate area segregated from the space used by the bathers by a barrier or wall at least 29 inches high." This means that spectators in street clothes are permitted only on the patio behind the Clubhouse and on the entrance patio in front of the pool gate.

- **Food and Drink:** With the exception of water in plastic bottles, no food or drink is permitted within the enclosed pool area or the bathhouses. The spectator areas may be used for eating and drinking. Only unbreakable containers may be used. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.

- **Boisterous Behavior:** No running, pushing or any type of boisterous behavior is permitted in or around the pool.

- **Age Restrictions:** The following age restrictions apply:

- 3 and Under: Children of diaper age are not permitted in the pool unless attired in Huggies "Little Swimmers" swim pants or LUVS "Splashwear" swim pants, which are approved by the Health Department and considered safe for swimming pool filter systems. Disposable diapers and training pants are not allowed.

- Under 14: No child under 14 is permitted in the pool area unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

- Under 18: From 6.p.m. until closing, children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
